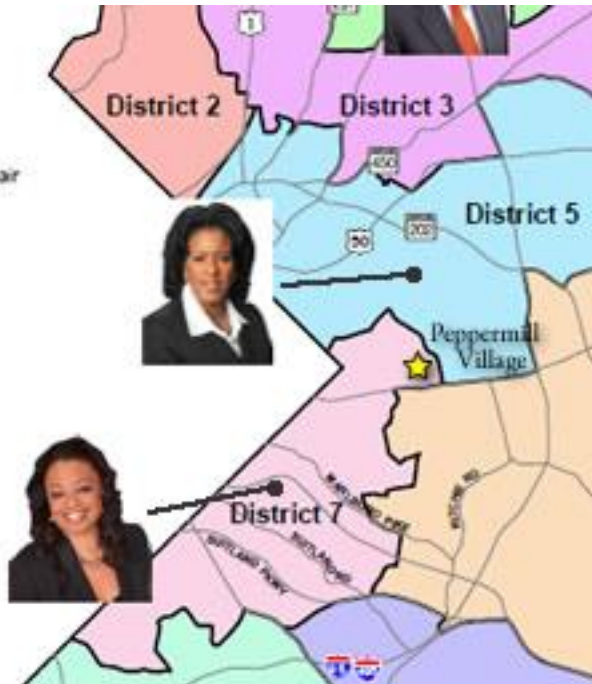

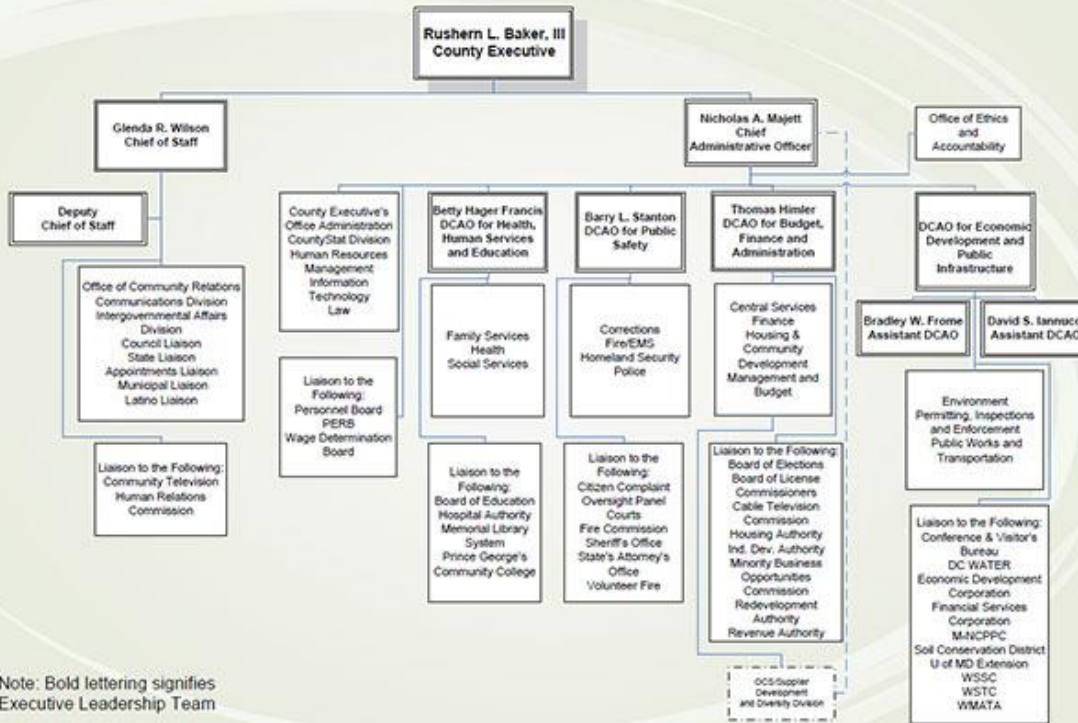


Organizational charts

Grassroots Lobbying

- **Be a grassroots lobbyist:** A quick and effective way to influence political decision makers is to call them. You can also write letters, attend public meetings and town hall meetings, and respond to MDF action alerts. And always thank them for any positive steps.
- **Meet in person:** When you take time out of your day to personally visit your councilmember, they notice. You will only get a few minutes, but that can be enough. Prepare an outline of your concerns and share your personal connection to the issue. Be concise. Ask questions and listen to the answer, it can be very revealing. Thank them for their time, remain cordial. Lay groundwork for future relationship building, keep the door open for communication
- **Dress for court, or at least the office:** PG government dress code is generally business professional or court – many legislators are attorneys.
- **Prepare to meet with your legislator:** Internet search, check the county website or their facebook page. What other causes does he or she champion? All politics are local; you might have other common ground upon which you can connect.
- **Become civic minded:** Join your civic association, HOA, union, PTA. Call your legislator's office, does his or her upcoming appearances include attendance at any public meetings? Attend.
- **Join forces** with other concerned folks in your district. It's much better to work as a team.
- **Have an elevator speech.** Impromptu encounters with your councilmember gives you the opportunity to reinforce our position against BSL. Develop a 30-second-or-less statement you have committed to memory that you can say as your shaking hands and saying hi.
- **Find common ground.** Ask questions, especially why they are of their opinion and position.
